



This medium-length hole is typically played into a prevailing wind. Tee shots must be played to the middle section of the fairway. From there, the second shot requires overcoming your poor posture and bizarre follow-through.



Ignore the water hazard and you'll be fine. That immense body of water over there. Don't think about losing your ball in that water. Don't think about that sinking feeling in your gut when you realize your ball is headed straight for that water. It will be hard to avoid that water, but don't think about it. Water.



The ideal drive here is anything that makes it past the ladies tee. From there it's a perfect opportunity to zig-zag up the fairway with your three-iron.



This one's kinda tough. If only you had some skill.





This challenging hole features a spacious, rolling fairway and a large, undulating green. Too bad your game features that challenging duck-hook.



This picturesque hole provides ample opportunity to photograph your group struggling with the rough.



This hole plays a bit long. But on the right day with a 60 MPH tailwind and soft, forgiving greens, you could get a six here.



On this picturesque par three, you should just hit the ball directly into the hole.





Hole #9, The Juniper, follows the natural contours of the land, stretching out beside long abandoned and historic rice fields, finally ending at the flag with your double bogey.



They say the best golf courses force you to use every club in your bag. For you, this hole will take care of that.



This hole is by far the easiest hole on the course. If you don't par this you should just give up the game.



On this hole, tee off with the club you can hit the farthest. Then after that, adjust your club selection based on how far away you are from the pin.



A relatively easy par 3, the green is guarded by your inability to hit a simple, short shot in front of a few people.





The conventional play here is down the middle. But we all know that's not going to happen.



A poorly-placed drive here will leave you with a more difficult shot than if you had hit a better drive. C'mon, hit a good shot this time.



After that last hole you're still keeping score? Just close your eyes and swing.



Put on your thinking cap for this one. There's the wind, the slope of the fairway, your odd stance, your terrible grip and that weird backswing hesitation thing you do.



This hole is too long, too narrow and the greens are too challenging. You should just sit in the cart and drink stuff.
